



Bev Dahlby is a Professor in the Department of Economics at the University of Alberta. His main area of teaching and research is public sector economics, especially tax policy and fiscal federalism. He has published many articles in these areas, and his book *The Marginal Cost of Public Funds: Theory and Applications* was published by MIT Press in 2008.

Bev Dahlby has served as a policy advisor for a number of national and international organizations. He has advised the Canadian federal government on the reform of business taxation and the fiscal equalization program, the evaluation of tax credits for television and film industry, and the taxation of inbound foreign direct investment. His international experience includes advisory work on tax reform in Malawi for the IMF and in Thailand for the Thailand Development Research Institute in Bangkok. In 2007, he served as the research director of the Alberta government's Financial Investment and Planning Advisory Commission and in 2008 he was an advisor to the World Bank on the reform of the fiscal transfer system in Brazil.
