Jack Mintz is a Fellow-in-Residence at the C.D. Howe Institute and also holds the Palmer Chair in Public Policy, University of Calgary. He was the President and CEO of the C. D. Howe Institute from 1999-2006.

He received his BA from the University of Alberta, his MA from Queen's University and his Ph.D. from the University of Essex. He has published widely in the field of public economics and named in 2004 as one of the world's most influential tax experts by a UK magazine.

Dr. Mintz was a Professor at the Rotman School of Business from 1989-2007. He has also been a Visiting Professor, New York University Law School, 2007, Clifford Clark Visiting Economist at the Department of Finance, Ottawa, and Chair of the federal government's Technical Committee on Business Taxation in 1996 and 1997, and Associate Dean (Academic) of the Faculty of Management, University of Toronto, 1993 – 1995.
