



## **C.D. Howe Institute Invites Applicants for Prestigious C.D. Howe Research Fellowship**

The C.D. Howe Institute, Canada's leading public policy research organization, has established, with the support of the C.D. Howe Memorial Foundation, a research fellowship for students from the graduate through the post-doctoral levels, who have a special and demonstrated interest in Canadian public policy. The Institute is now seeking candidates for the position.

### **Fellowship Details**

The C.D. Howe Fellowship will ordinarily be a one-year work term. Shorter terms may be possible. The Fellowship is intended to expose an outstanding student of significant promise to leading-edge thinking on public policy issues and to provide an opportunity for the successful candidate to pursue independent public policy research under the tutelage of the Institute's senior staff. This will involve original research, review of work by outside authors, preparation of research for publication and presentation of conclusions to policymakers, business people, academics and the media.

By attending policy Roundtables, conferences, meetings and informal discussions, and by interacting with the Institute's internationally renowned policy analysts and scholars, the Fellow will augment intellectual and practical experience and gain exposure to advanced thinking in such areas as fiscal, monetary and tax policy, economic growth and innovation, social policy, governance and public institutions, as well as international and trade policy. The Fellow will be a full member of the Institute's research committee and will participate in research discussion on these and other topics.

The Ideal Candidate Will Have:

- An outstanding academic record, with at least three years of post-secondary study in economics, commerce or a related discipline; graduate level candidates are preferred, though applications from undergraduates are also encouraged;
- A solid grounding in economics, both theoretical and applied; some empirical work on Canadian topics would be a definite asset;
- An active interest in Canadian policy issues, with some background in Canadian history, politics, and governance;
- Effective oral and written communication skills, and
- A facility with computer applications, including spreadsheets, statistical analysis and micro-simulation packages.

### **Application Process, Timelines and Salary Information**

This position is intended to attract top candidates. The salary for this position is \$40,000 and it will be located in Toronto. Moving expenses, subject to a limit, will be covered for successful out-of-town candidates.

The Fellow will be chosen through an open, competitive search process, utilizing a committee of three scholars to assess applications. Interested candidates should forward their resume, covering letter and three letters of reference, including at least two academic references.

To apply you must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada or authorized in writing to work in Canada under the federal Immigration Act. You will only be asked for proof if an offer of employment is made to you.
